Medicare Open Payments Program Year 2020 Data Review Period Now Open

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services has opened the <u>pre-publication review and dispute period</u> for its Open Payment national disclosure program. Physician review of the data is voluntary, but strongly encouraged. Disputes must be initiated by May 15 to be reflected in the June 2021 data publication. Please note that registration in the Open Payments system is required to participate in review and dispute activities.

CMS Updates List of Covered Telehealth Services

On April 7 the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released an <u>updated list of services</u> <u>reimbursable via telehealth</u>. The updated list includes tympanometry, audiometry, speech therapy, cochlear implant follow-ups, and other codes commonly used by AAO-HNS members and their practices. While some of these codes are included on telehealth list permanently, many are only reimbursable via telehealth until the end of the year in which the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency ends.

CMS Releases New 2021 Quality Payment Program Resources

On April 22 the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) made several new Quality Payment Program (QPP) resources available to clinicians. These resources include a Performance Year 2021 Merit-based Incentive Payment Systems (MIPS) user guide, MIPS Measures and Activities Specialty Guides, Medicare
